A Message from Fr. Kubista:

Believing in God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and that He is with His Church through the power of the Holy Spirit, can be challenging at times. We know that Jesus has given himself for us and most profoundly we receive him in the Eucharist. We come to Jesus who gives us eternal life. We are to be like Peter in the gospel and say "we have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God" (Jn 6:69)

In the gospel, we hear how Jesus is telling the people that he is the true bread that has come down from heaven. He tells them that whoever eats his flesh and drinks his blood will be fed, will remain in him, will be raised on the last day, and will have eternal life. Yet, we hear how many of Jesus' disciples left him. How painful that must have been for Jesus. Today, Jesus wants us to eat his very body and blood which allows him to get very close to us for he comes into us. Although Jesus cannot experience pain now, he must be saddened to see people leave his Church and not receive him. We too, are saddened when family or friends leave the Church for whatever reason. We know that it is through the Church especially in the sacraments, where we can substantially experience the love of Jesus, the healing power of Jesus, that same healing power Jesus displayed in many instances in the gospels and the healing power he died to give us in Grace, the very life of himself in the Holy Spirit. It is a reminder that we are to pray for our Church, pray for others especially those who have left or are considering leaving, that they would come to see a greater presence of Christ in the Church especially in us so that through the power of God's grace, they may seek to find Christ in a substantial way through his Church, especially the sacraments.

In the gospel, we hear how Peter when Jesus asked what the apostles wanted to do, spoke up and professed that he wanted to stay with Jesus. We know that Peter denies Jesus three times later on in the Gospels and then turns back to him. Peter reminds us of how weak we can be and how much we all need a savior, a healer, how much we need Jesus. When we are down, depressed, struggling or discouraged we are to turn to Jesus and ask him to give us strength knowing that he loves us beyond our imagining. We can pray, Jesus, you are the one to whom I hold my allegiance, my dedication, my faithfulness. You are the biggest reason why I believe and am part of the Catholic Church because you founded it on Peter, the head of the Apostles, and said that you would always be with it, to guide and help it by the power of the Holy Spirit, to continue your message of love, to continue your work. We believe this and know that you are with us.

We pray, God our Father, we are so thankful for your providential Love that through whatever we experience You will always be there for us. Your Love will help us get through all things. With your son Jesus, at our side, nothing can stop us if we trust in You and in Jesus. Help us to find our strength in you and to allow your grace, your very life, through your Son Jesus Christ, in the power of the Holy Spirit, to dwell in us and grow each and every day in us. We have come to believe that Your son Jesus is the Messiah, the Savior of the world, and that through and in his Church, You will save us if we but persevere in our faith, our hope, and especially our love. August is the Month of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart. Since the 16th century Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. The month of August is traditionally dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The physical heart of Mary is venerated (and not adored as the Sacred Heart of Jesus is) because it is united to her person and is the seat of her love (especially for her divine Son), virtue, and inner life. Such devotion is an incentive to a similar love and virtue

This devotion has received new emphasis in this century from the visions given to Lucy Dos Santos, oldest of the visionaries of Fatima, in her convent in Tuy, in Spain, in 1925 and 1926. In the visions Our Lady asked for the practice of the Five First Saturdays to help make amends for the offenses committed against her heart by the blasphemies and ingratitude of men. The practice parallels the devotion of the Nine First Fridays in honor of the Sacred Heart.

On October 31, 1942, Pope Pius XII made a solemn Act of Consecration of the Church and the whole world to the Immaculate Heart. Let us remember this devotion year-round, but particularly through the month of August.
