A Message from Fr. Kubista:

Worrying about whatever impacts our lives either for good or not. The Webster's New World Dictionary says worry is *"to cause to feel troubled or uneasy; make anxious; distress."* As can be seen from the definition, these things can either be good or bad depending on how they impact us, how worrying moves our thoughts and actions. We can be worried about what someone is going to think of us or future events, like how things are going to go for us the next day. This sense of being worried can either be good or bad; good if it spurs us to be better and bad if it hinders of us in any way. Maybe we are worried because we have not followed things that we should have followed: we didn't follow the commandments or the laws of the Church and are concerned that we have hurt our relationship with God and our brother and sister. This is a good sense of being worried and can help us do better next time.

Worrying can hinder us and be bad for us. It can take energy out of us as our mind can get so focused on whatever we are worried about that it drains us from focusing on things in the present, on what we should be doing now. As a result, we can be less attentive towards others or to the situation we find ourselves. We can make more mistakes on what we are doing because our mind is being torn apart. We may not do things as well because our motivation to excel at what we are doing is being pulled down by worrying. Worrying can pull us down and hinder us from doing what we should do.

Worrying can help us and move us positively. It can give us energy when we realize that it does matter what we do and how we think. It can help us be more attentive to people because we are concerned with them and that we want to do right by them. Worrying can motivate us as we realize the importance of what we are doing and try to do better. It can move us to love our God and our brother and sister even more. Worrying can help move us to be a better person.

Christ says we are not to worry which implies that at a certain point we should no longer worry about something. If we have done all that we can, then we have to let go of the worry and if we don't it moves us into anxiety, which is not good. Anxiety is defined in Webster's New World Dictionary as the "state of being uneasy, apprehensive, or worried about what may happen, concern about a possible future event." When we worry about things which are out of our control it is not good and makes our situation worse. What we need to do is to let go; to do the best we can and then let God take care of the rest (trust God). This is not easy to do and we need to ask Jesus to help us with it. At every mass we ask Jesus for this help when the priest says. "Deliver us Lord from every evil, and grant us peace in our day. In your mercy keep us free from sin and protect us from all anxiety, as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Savior Jesus Christ." We are called to wait in joyful hope and not to let worrying and anxiety get in the way of us growing closer to God and to our brother and sister.

Let us ask God to help us to let go of those things in our life which we are worrying about, those things which are out of our control. We can pray that God will take care of them and then let them be. As Matthew 6:34 says: "*Do not worry about tomorrow; tomorrow will take care of itself.*" God bless you.

Archdiocese Announces Appointment

Pope Francis named Father Kevin Thomas Kenney, a priest of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis, as an auxiliary bishop of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis, assigning him the titular see of Cunavia. Bishop-elect Kenney is currently the pastor of the Church of St. Olaf in downtown Minneapolis, the parochial administrator of the Church of Sts. Cyril and Methodius in Minneapolis, and chaplain at DeLaSalle High School. His episcopal ordination is scheduled for 1 p.m. Monday, October 28th, at the Cathedral of St. Paul.
