A Message from Fr. Kubista:

(Continued from last week...) If they have taken a given stance on certain issues in the recent past and now suddenly have changed, we should be leery of voting for them because they might just be changing their ideas to get elected and once elected, will not implement or follow through with what they said but will go back to what they really believe. We are not to be fooled or lied to and if so, this is another reason for us to not vote for that candidate.

We want people who lead and not ones who are led. If we look at a candidate and they are changing their ideas based on popular opinion, this should be a red flag for us. They probably do not have any solid moral stance and we should be afraid of electing them. We also should look for candidates who are looking for the common good of all (born and unborn) and not solely or disproportionately for the good or the perceived good of their constituents. It is important to know that the common good encompasses all; it does not only encompass the United States, but all people of our world. Some candidates might be focused on too narrow of the picture and/or an immoral view of the common good. Our country should not be promoting immorality (like abortion) in other countries.

We want candidates of sound moral character who follow the laws of God. We want people who uphold the laws of God and who are willing to stand by Him. Some have tried to take God out of the Pledge of Allegiance. "The phrase "under God" was incorporated into the Pledge of Allegiance [on] June 14, 1954, by a joint resolution of Congress amending §4 of the Flag Code enacted in 1942." Certainly, this was added later and some might argue that it is not wise to put it in but it is in and we are blessed because of it. "In God we trust" first appeared on U.S. coins in 1864 and has appeared on paper currency since 1957" This also has been around and again, if we trust in God, He will take care of us.

When looking at a candidate, then, it seems like they should be someone who is God fearing, who is God centered; this should be an important factor for us as Christians in electing someone. They should believe in God and try to follow in His ways (live the faith). If we, ourselves, really believe in God, then we know and understand the power of God and the power, wisdom, and Grace that God shares with those who are Christians and who practice and live their faith (the faith of Jesus Christ). As Catholics and Christians, we should look at this element in a candidate and not underestimate its significance. If we truly believe that God blesses those who follow His commands and His will, then in a certain sense, if we elect someone who is not "God fearing", we in a sense reject the importance of God and His significance in our lives and the lives of others. Again, we cannot underestimate this aspect and really should look at the candidate with great scrutiny in this area. If they are not in with God, then the chances of their decisions being in line with the Will of God and the good of all will be compromised. When we put God first, He blesses us and our country.

We pray that God would guide us to determine which candidates are God centric, who are true leaders, who stand up for what is right and just no matter what popular opinion is, and who are of sound moral character who follow His laws and as such will be blessed and be a blessing for our country. We pray that we fulfill our duty to vote and properly discern which candidate is best. We pray for our country, that we would turn more towards God, realizing that only in Him, will we be blessed. God bless you and God bless America.
