For The Sake of His Sorrowful Passion, Have Mercy on Us and On The Whole World

A Message from Fr. Kubista:

There is no salvation outside the Catholic Church for everyone in Heaven will be part of it. One of the main reasons Jesus Christ came was to found a Church, which is also referred to as the Kingdom of God (or Kingdom of Heaven). Jesus founded his Church when he said to Simon Peter: "you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it." (Matthew 16:18). The term "Catholic Church" was first used around 110AD by St. Ignatius of Antioch in his "Letter to the Smyrnaeans." (Catholic literally means universal.)

Jesus wants us to be part of his Church so there are many times when he shares with us how to be a part of it. In the first moments of Jesus' public ministry, we hear him say: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." (Mark 1:15) At the Last Supper, Jesus says to his Apostles: "I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing." (John 15:5) He then says: "If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love." (John 15:10)

There can only be one Church because if there are two, then one is different. The Truth (who is Jesus Christ) cannot have differences so we want to be part of the one that Christ instituted. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#847) says that those "who, through no fault of their own, do not know the Gospel of Christ or his Church" but live a life in God's ways, can be saved. We do not exactly know what Purgatory is like but one of the things that can happen in it is that one is purified in Christ and in the ways of the Kingdom of God.

All of us are called to be children of God for our created end is to love and to be with Him. God loves us and He even loves the Devil and still holds him in existence (although the Devil hates God). The created order is a very powerful way that God shows us a glimpse of His wonder, power, and awe, and how much He loves us, giving us a free choice in order to love (choose) Him in return. God creates within us, an inclination to seek Him which is one of the reasons why people throughout the world worship (raise their minds) to some higher power, that power, whether they know it or not, is God. When St. Paul was in Athens during one of his missionary journeys, he noticed that the Athenians had a monument "to an unknown god" and so he pointed out to them that that god was the Triune God, the Creator of the entire universe. Like St. Paul, we are to share our faith (share the Good News) with others in part that Christ left us his Church which is a source of Grace (the Holy Spirit) that allows us to fulfill the end for which God created us: to be with God our Father, Jesus our brother, in the power of the Holy Spirit, to be part of the Mystical Body of Christ the Church for all eternity. As St. Augustine says in his Confessions: "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You."

Salvation comes from Jesus Christ who instituted the Catholic Church which is his Mystical Body (the family (Kingdom) of God) and to which we are invited to be a member. We are to pray for others who have drifted away from her, for other Christians who do not belong to her, and for others who have not heard of her. We are so thankful to Jesus that we have been given the opportunity to be part of His Church. God bless you.
