## A Message from Fr. Kubista:

Blasphemy is something that is a very serious sin. It is a sin against the second commandment: Thou shall not take the name of the Lord in vain. Blasphemy is mocking, attacking, or showing irreverence towards God.

The Catholic Encyclopedia (CE) defines blasphemy as: "Blasphemy (Greek blaptein, "to injure", and pheme, "reputation") signifies etymologically gross irreverence towards any person or thing worthy of exalted esteem....While etymologically blasphemy may denote the derogation of the honour due to a creature as well as of that belonging to God, in its strict acceptation it is used only in the latter sense."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) says this: "Blasphemy is directly opposed to the second commandment. It consists in uttering against God - inwardly or outwardly - words of hatred, reproach, or defiance; in speaking ill of God; in failing in respect toward him in one's speech; in misusing God's name. St. James condemns those "who blaspheme that honorable name [of Jesus] by which you are called."(CCC #2148) The Catholic Dictionary (CD) says blasphemy is: "Speaking against God in a contemptuous, scornful, or abusive manner…Included under blasphemy are offenses committed by thought, word, or action."(CD)

We owe God respect and reverence because at a minimum, He is our Creator and holds us in existence. "Blasphemy is a sin against the virtue of religion by which we render to God the honour due to Him as our first beginning and last end." (CE) "Blasphemy is contrary to the respect due God and his holy name. It is in itself a grave sin." (CCC #2148) The CD says: "Blasphemy is a grave violation of charity toward God." (CD) Because God is so far above us, any sin directed to Him is very serious. "The seriousness of an affront is proportioned to the dignity of the person towards whom it is directed. Since then the insult in blasphemy is offered to the ineffable majesty of God, the degree of its heinousness must be evident." (CE)

Blasphemy does not only apply to God, but also to other persons and things. "The prohibition of blasphemy extends to language against Christ's Church, the saints, and sacred things."(CCC #2148) "Serious contemptuous ridicule of the saints, sacred objects, or of persons consecrated to God is also blasphemous because God is indirectly attacked."(CD) "It is also blasphemous to make use of God's name to cover up criminal practices, to reduce peoples to servitude, to torture persons or put them to death. The misuse of God's name to commit a crime can provoke others to repudiate religion."(CCC #2148) One cannot use God's name to justify evil.

There was a blasphemous event that occurred at the 2024 Summer Olympics in France. The National Catholic Register (NCR) reported: "The blasphemous segment mocking Jesus' Last Supper with his apostles during the Opening Ceremony of the Olympic Games on the evening of July 26 was deeply contrary to the Olympic spirit of communion and unity, according to the Catholic Church's delegate to the Olympics, Bishop Emmanuel Gobilliard....The most offensive passage, parodying Leonardo da Vinci's iconic painting, depicted Christ as a lesbian DJ surrounded by drag queens." In another article, the NCR wrote: "Freedom of expression, which is obviously not called into question, finds its limit in respect for others," the Holy See concluded in its statement... In [and open letter to the IOC] — signed by three cardinals and 24 bishops — the prelates stated: "It is hard to understand how the faith of over 2 billion people can be so casually and intentionally blasphemed."" As Christians, we are to challenge people who are blasphemous so that it is known to them and others that what they have done is wrong and hopefully those blaspheming will change their ways for their own good.

We pray that all would show respect and reverence to God, His Church, and those things set apart for holy use (sacred things). We pray that people would not commit the sin of blasphemy so that they do not call upon themselves the disfavor of God. God bless you.
