A Message from Fr. Kubista:

We are called to take care of our world as God intended it. In the beginning of the world, when God created the heavens and the earth, on the sixth day of Creation, God commanded Adam and Eve to: *"Be fertile and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it."*(Gen 1:28) Subdue is a translation and the word implies a sort of control of Creation. If we read the context, though, the idea trying to be conveyed is more that it is *"to subject to oneself"*, which means to use Creation for one's benefit, to help it thrive so that humanity thrives. It does not imply mastery over Creation with a sense of changing it, for God had created the world and it was very good. If we think we can change it, we are thinking we can do better than God, and that is a fallacy.

It is important to realize that the world we live in is different than it was before the Flood. There is evidence that the climate was less volatile (more moderate) before the Flood than it is now. In other words, we have already had climate change and a substantial climate change during and after the Flood. God knew that the Flood was going to happen when He created the world. So He would have had safeguards in place which would have mitigated the Flood, so that after the Flood, the world (although more volatile), would have been balanced and would reach an equilibrium state, a state which would be habitable and allow humanity to thrive, although in a diminished manner. (Sin does not only impact human persons, it impacts all of Creation.)

Some believe that we must change our climate in order to save the planet. They think that we can mess around with the atmosphere (including the weather) so that we control "global warming" (which is a theory). "One of the techniques already being used in several places in the U.S. is weather modification, or cloud seeding, which involves injecting microscopic particles of silver iodide into the atmosphere to encourage rain and snowfall." Manipulating the environment (climate) is called geo-engineering and implies that we are trying to change the way God set up the conditions on earth because we assume we know better. It is a huge fallacy and can lead us down the path to negatively affecting ourselves and our world and it can have serious consequences, especially spiritually.

One of the more prominent ideas to change the atmosphere (to try to "cool" the planet) is what is called stratospheric aerosol injection (*SAI*). This technique uses particles that block some of sun's rays from reaching the earth, so that they earth is not warmed as much, similar to the effect of smoke from a volcano. In July 2022, an MIT report said that the US government is developing a solar geo-engineering research plan. "The one that's gained the most attention is using planes or balloons to disperse tiny particles in the stratosphere. These would then—in theory reflect back enough sunlight to ease warming, mimicking the effect of massive volcanic eruptions in the past." In June 2023, the government was planning to have a five year study on climate engineering and on June 30, 2023, it released a report which said that "stratospheric aerosol injection is releasing particles of sulfur dioxide or another substance into the upper atmosphere to reflect sunlight away from the Earth. Marine cloud brightening is meant to improve the reflectivity of certain clouds by injecting sea salt or through other methods." Geo-engineering is not a recent endeavor as there is evidence that it has been studied earlier; the government had discussed it in 2009 and 2010.

One of the ways to block the sun's rays through atmospheric dispersion is using a jet to disperse particles either from its engines or spray nozzles mounted on its wings. These dispersions are called chem-trails. The documentary *The Dimming* and an interview with Robert F. Kennedy Jr. (both on geoengineeringwatch.org) describe the issue. (Continued next week...)

Feast of the Presentation (Candlemas) and the Blessing of Candles Feb 1st/2nd

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord: This feast was originally celebrated in the Eastern Churches as "The Meeting" or "Encountering" (Hypapante), in the Church mankind meets the Lord. By the sixth century it began to be celebrated in the West, where the focus became the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary and was accompanied by solemn blessings and processions with candles; hence, it is popularly called "Candlemas." By the offerings of the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Joseph and the prophecy of St. Simeon, the life of Christ here begins to point toward his Resurrection. If you have candles that you want to have blessed, please set them on the steps in front of Fr. Kubista's chair prior to the start of Mass.



Blessing of Throats on Feb 1st/2nd (Feast of St Blaise Feb 3rd)

Blaise was a hard-working bishop dedicated to encouraging the spiritual and physical health of his people in Sebastea, Armenia. Although the Edict of Toleration which granted freedom of worship in the Roman empire had been signed five years prior, religious persecution still raged in the country. According to a legend, a mother came to him with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Bishop Blaise's command, the child coughed up the bone. In another tale, Blaise was being led to the prison in Sebastea, and on the way came across a poor old woman whose pig had been stolen by a wolf. Blaise commanded the wolf return the pig,

which it did -alive and uninjured - to the amazement of all. In 316 AD he was beheaded for not sacrificing to the pagan gods. The account of his life was written nearly 400 years later. The Germans and Slavs hold him in special honor and for decades many United States Catholics have sought the annual St. Blaise blessing for their throats.
