A Message from Fr. Kubista:

(Continued from last week...) From the article Are persistent aircraft trails a threat to the environment and health? by Fabien Deruelle, PhD. which was in the journal "Reviews on Environmental Health" (7/7/2021), he says that "many scientists attribute the growing number of persistent aircraft trails to the mere increase in air traffic. Nevertheless, there are publications, political issues, patents and observations indicating that these persistent trails are sprays of chemical compounds, known as solar geoengineering by stratospheric aerosol injection (SAI), aimed at changing the climate. These chemicals would be mainly composed of metallic particles, nanoparticles, sulfur and black carbon, causing air, soil and water pollution and therefore having a strong impact on health, including negative affects to the pulmonary, cardiovascular, and central nervous systems, and inhibiting the intake of vitamin D... Interest (especially by the military) in climate control is not recent. Indeed, an electromagnetic technology, with very strong environmental and health side effects, would seem to have been deployed and activated since the 1990s without the public being informed about it but to the official knowledge of governments. In addition, one military document shows that this electromagnetic technology requires chemical spraying to manipulate weather... The metal particles (such as aluminum, barium) that would be contained in these aerosols are among the causes of neurodegenerative diseases such as Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, autism, transmissible spongiform encephalopathies, amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, multiple sclerosis...It can be noted that all these environmental and health impacts have been observed, measured, demonstrated and have been constantly increasing for many years." Other studies show that aluminum can be a major threat to humans, animals, and plants and barium may damage the kidneys amongst other things. "These sprays would be mainly composed of metallic particles (Al, Ba, Sr, Fe, nanoparticles) and sulfur, which would considerably increase air, soil and water pollution. Many of the current environmental and health problems are consistent with those described in the literature on solar geoengineering by SAI if this method was employed. For example, metal particles used are well known environmental contaminants, ozone layer depletion, cardiorespiratory diseases, neurodegenerative diseases, sunburn. The observations (whiter skies, less solar power) also correspond to the same risks as those described in the solar geoengineering works. Patents show that this weather modification technology has been known and mastered for a long time. In addition, some scientific papers as well as policy documents suggest that solar geoengineering by SAI has been used for many years." I have seen multiple times where there was a white trail from a plane which abruptly stops. It cannot be the jet engine being shut off, fuel tanks with different mixtures could be switched resulting in different exhaust (which seems unlikely), so more probably it must be dispersion spray nozzles being turned on and off.

People are trying to take action and demand transparency. There are governmental officials (who have written legislation) who have questioned geo-engineering. Tennessee has already passed a law and eleven other states (including Minnesota) are working on laws. The bill in Minnesota is SF 4630 which is for Harmful Atmospheric Activity. Part of it reads: "Prohibition; penalty. (a) A person may not engage in a polluting atmospheric activity or use an unmarked or unidentified aircraft or other vehicle or facility: (1) for weather-engineering, cloud-seeding, stratospheric aerosol injection, or other atmospheric activity that is harmful to humans or the environment; or(2) to produce excessive electromagnetic radiation that is harmful to humans or the environment. (b) A person who violates this subdivision is guilty of a felony and subject to a fine of \$500,000.""

We need to be good stewards of the environment (to use its resources more efficiently and effectively) and do nothing that will harm it or our health. We have to be careful that we do not do things (like geo-engineering), thinking that we know how they will affect our environment when we really do not, for God knows best. We are to facilitate and promote (to have dominion over and subdue) our planet (our environment) and its natural processes (including ecosystems) so that they thrive in their natural God given course.
