A Message from Fr. Kubista:

Dating is a question that should be addressed especially by parents who have children of high school age. What is the purpose of dating and when should it be done.

What does the word date mean? There are a number of definitions but the one that we will focus on is related to people and relationships. Date (noun) is "a social meeting planned before it happens, especially one between two people who have or might have a romantic relationship" or "an appointment to meet at a specified time" or "a person with whom one has a usually romantic date" To date (verb) is "to regularly spend time with someone you have a romantic relationship with" or "to make a usually romantic social arrangement to meet with: to have a date with" We will focus on dating, which is regularly spending time with someone leading to marriage.

There are various aspects of dating. In *Dating: A Practical Catholic Guide*, Jason King gives reasons for dating: to find someone to marry, to prevent one from being lonely, to experience different kinds of relationships, to learn to relate to people of opposite sex, and to love a person for who they are. Jason says that dating is a way we learn how to love with Christian love. Another source said dating was a sampling process to see if one wants to move to a more "serious relationship". Dr. Mario Sacasa, in *Catholic Dating 101: A Better Way to Date*, says that dating is primarily about finding God's will and from it to learn to love the other person while growing individually, and thus gain a better understanding of God's plan for one's life. Dr. Sacasa talks about how prayer is important before, during, and after the date, to reflect in one's own mind and with others (including parents), and then act appropriately as to how God is guiding. In *Dating as a Practicing Catholic*, Christina Sorrentino says that dating is a discernment period where both individuals grow in virtue, holiness, and their relationship and knowledge of each other, which is guided by God to discern if they are to be married. So dating is repetitively meeting (spending time) with a person of the opposite sex with the main purpose to get to know that person in order to marry.

Exclusive dating means that one is repetitively meeting with a specific person of the opposite sex (they do not go with anyone else). This implies that those dating are more seriously discerning whether the other is a suitable person to marry which is why the exclusiveness, there is a good chance that it will lead to marriage. Courtship is similar to exclusive dating, although it might be considered a more serious step along the path to marriage, as it is the step before engagement. Jason King says that courtship presupposes the real possibility of marriage.

Let's look at the progression of a relationship that leads to marriage. First a couple starts to get to know each other and become friends. This should be the first step in any relationship and this friendship should continue no matter how things proceed between the couple, they should always be friends. Sadly, many friendships end because of the hurt that occurs in the way things progress in the relationship. It is good that a couple spend time in a group. Then the couple decides that they want to spend more time together and so they enter into a "dating" relationship. The relationship does not have to be exclusive at this point so they could "date" go out with another person. Once it is determined that the person is a good possibility to marry, the couple then enters into exclusive dating and then courtship. Then the last step would be engagement, when they have decided to marry and are preparing for it in a substantial way. Nowhere in the process should the couple simulate marriage (including cohabitation) for when they are married they will be given God's graces so they can indeed fulfill their vows.
